In certain circumstances, after a work injury, you are released to return to work with restrictions. What this means is that although you are unable to perform your normal job, you are capable of doing something. If you are released to return to work with restrictions, it is up to your employer to offer to you, work within your restrictions. This should be done in writing. If you return to work but are not making the same amount of money that you were earning prior to your work injury, the insurance carrier for your employer must pay you a percentage of the difference between what you are earning and what you were earning before your work injury. These benefits are referred to as partial disability benefits. The exact amount is based on your actual wages.
